SUPPORTING OPERATION HOPE

Operation Hope, is a 501C3 organization, that takes in homeless families. They have certain criteria for parents. The parents cannot be drug addicts or alcoholics. They give the families counseling and job opportunities. After 6 months the families are placed in housing and Operation Hope helps them maintain their jobs, counseling and pantry distribution. This insures the families will not be homeless again. This is so important for the children to have a safe home, attend school and not have hunger issues.

Since October 20, 2020, our club has delivered all left over food that is brought to the poor residents. The left-over food is from 5 to 10 boxes each week. Different grocery stores rotate donating food to our Park. We get up to six boxes of frozen meat, fresh picked fruit from our park residents and lots of bakery, breads, and miscellaneous items. The food is all in date and no out dated food is given. When the food has been disbursed each Friday, Gayle Lacy goes and picks up the leftover food and takes it all to Operation Hope, on Vista Way in Vista. We have made 10 trips and delivered over \$971.00

Mileage driven was 340 miles from June to August 10. It is such a blessing this food goes where it is needed. When Gayle Lacy cannot deliver Ysella Sharp takes the food.

PURSES FOR OPERATION HOPE



CELL TOWER UPDATE

VERIZON

As many of you know we took an advance payout on the rent of the cell tower from Verizon. We are now having our roof repaired and have invested some of those funds for use 9 years from now.

ATT

ATT has contacted us and we are in the midst of negotiations. They want to lease 13X20 foot area to the west of our storage unit. WCO has asked for \$3.00 a square foot for monthly rent and a 3% accelerator each year. AT&T has agreed to the placement and the funds. They are now having legal write up the proposal for our signatures. WCO expects this to be completed prior to January 2022. That means the club would receive \$900.00 per month rent for 10 years.



The Great Kindness Challenge

HELPING KIDS LEARN KINDNESS



With in-person school resuming, now is a great time to tackle issues of kindness. Before the pandemic, many kids suffered from bullying in our schools. Since the pandemic, we've seen unprecedented levels of incivility across America - and kids have been learning from the larger society.

WCO member Heather Hebert del Cuadro has brought this issue forward within the Oceanside Schools in a positive way, with a national project called "Kids for Peace, Kindness Unites." It's a simple effort, collecting paper grocery bags & cereal boxes for kids to cut into "love links." The kids (and adults too!) will hand-painted each link with a message of love, empathy and caring. All the links will be connected in November to form chains, and there is a nation-wide competition for how long they can make the "love chain."
