ROOF REPLACEMENT VOTING

MAY GENERAL MEETING THURSDAY, MAY 5, 2021

It's time to do maintenance work on the roof of the Woman's Club! On the west side of main ceiling tiles, we have a water leak marks that span $\frac{3}{4}$ of the room.

Our by-laws require a 2/3 majority vote of membership to approve the roof repair as it is a capitol repair. We have had a quote of \$14,500.00. This was the lowest quote and it includes: City permits, removal of old roof, new tar, sealer and the pebbles. It would be a complete replacement of all materials and would guarantee the roof for 5 years all work and materials.

This is an extremely low quote. Last year a company estimated a quote of \$40,000 (without inspection on the roof). One year and corona virus has changed some things. COME AND CAST YOUR VOTE ON NEW ROOF! Thanks Maria Carrasco, VP2 for gathering information for the repairs of the building.

INVESTMENT UPDATE

Q&A SCHEDULED FOR MAY 5, 2021 GENERAL MEETING

CALPRO Network Financial Services is a 35-year-old company that assists individuals and non-profit groups in secure investments. MICHAEL GEORGE is the representative we have been speaking with regarding \$175,000.00 of our Cell Tower Funds. We have spoken to 4 investment counselors and most want to use the Stock Market or Bonds and this club cannot take risks, with the initial investment.

We would buy a fixed annuity for 7 years the rate would be 3.05%. Your initial investment would be 100% secure. The investment would be with Jackson National who has been in business for over 65 years. They are a AAA+ rated company.

You must attend the May meeting to vote on this important issue. One board member stated she thought the money should just stay in the bank. The bank is paying .001% interest. At the end of 7 years we would have earned \$175.00 on the \$175,000. Today we will receive the 3.05% which is \$5337.50 a year equaling \$37,362.50.

If we do not take this investment immediately we will have to take 3% a year which reduce the interest by \$612.00. The club initially voted to invest \$175,000.00 and have 100,000. Plus, the \$49,900.00 in savings as resources for 10 years. We have already drawn the 1st years allotment of 15,000 into our checking account for the \$6,000.00 operating expenses and \$9,000.00 for donations and fundraising expenses.

After the first year, the President, Treasurer and Financial Secretary could draw 20% of funds for emergency use if there was a disaster. But two of the three officers must sign to take out any funds which would reduce the interest income. The club wanted to secure the Woman's Club Revenue for 20 years. This is how we guarantee the club revenue for 20 years.

There is no risk in earning \$37,362.50 Interest income on our \$175,000.00.
