WCO SUPPORTING FIRE-FIGHTER EDUCATION

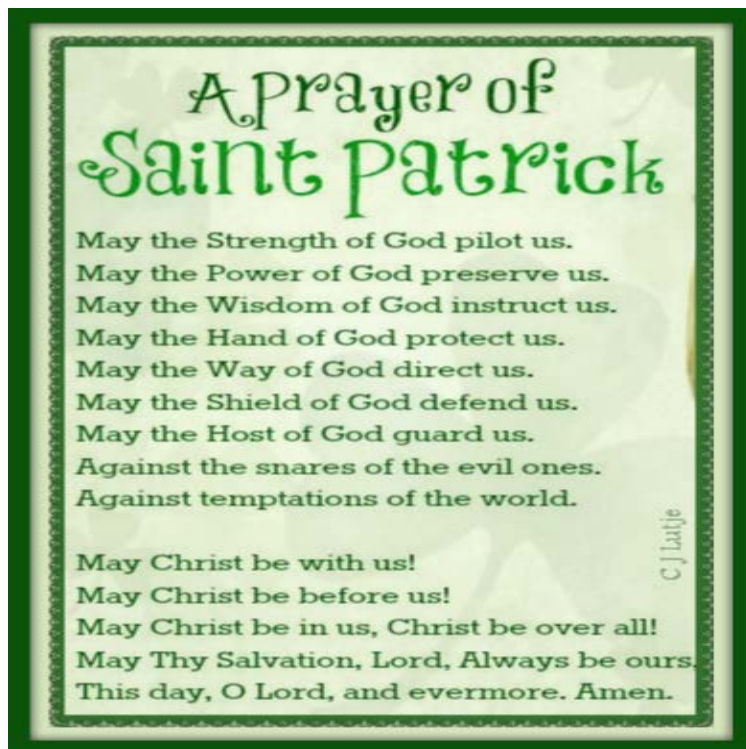

••• Bacon Roses Recipe •••

- 12 slices uncooked bacon
- 24 Spinach Leaves
- 12 skewer sticks
- 24 toothpicks
- Cup- Cake Pan
- bowl of uncooked white rice optional (to stand up roses.)

Roll each piece of bacon and as you roll let the center be higher. When end of bacon turn tip backwards and put toothpick in bacon. Place 2nd toothpick in bacon to balance it to sit inside the cupcake pan. Bake 10 Min at 350 degrees for crispy bacon cook 20 minutes. Cool then pull out the small toothpicks. Use 2 spinach Leaves, bacon rose On top and put a skewer thru the bottom of spinach leaves and roses. Makes a pretty arrangement. Or simply place the spinach leaves on plate top with rose bacon. Really great with Heart shaped toast cooked with egg in the middle. - Contributed by Gayle Lacy
